UWM JOB OPENING

Assistant Professor (Composition/Music Technology/Theory) at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee; full time nine-month appointment, tenure track. Teach undergraduate and graduate composition in acoustic, electronic, and multimedia; teach and develop graduate and upper division theory and technology courses; teach as part of a rotation in the undergraduate core theory; remain professionally active and continue to grow a significant reputation as a composer; actively contribute to the life of the Department of Music and the Peck School of the Arts. A Doctorate in Music Composition is required; ABD candidates with a clear expected date for completion will be considered. Supportive materials must include a letter of application, curriculum vitae, three letters of recommendation sent directly from placement bureau or other sources, and three scores with recordings. Additionally, articles and other supplementary material may be included at this time. The residency should include opportunities for the High School Orchestra students (about 60 - 65) to work with the composer in composition and in general performance, as well as the commission of a work to be premiered by the MHS Orchestra.

Dolby 5.1 mixes of the works. The title of the disc was created using a statistical analysis of the titles of the individual pieces included on the disc.


Several of the works are expressions of manifold composition. "Manifold composition" is term that was introduced by Sever Tipei in 1989. It refers to composition as an expression of an idea, as opposed to an absolute aesthetic object. That is that manifold composition can generate any number of "manifolds" that are similar to each other, but differ from manifold to manifold. Some of the pieces use video manifolds (different videos that are generated from the same materials using the same process, but with different initial conditions), while other pieces utilize both video manifolds and musical manifolds (different music that is generated using the same process, but with different initial conditions).
