ENTRY GUIDELINES AND SUBMISSION PROCEDURES:

* Submit one or more works for CLARINET ENSEMBLE or a CHAMBER ENSEMBLE FEATURING CLARINET that has/ have been composed within the past three years. Works must be unpublished, and must not have previously won any award. There are no duration restrictions. There is no entry fee.

* Submit one copy of each score and a CD recording (required MIDI acceptable). Remove your name and other identifying marks from your score(s) and CD(s).

* Complete an entry form for each submission, and send the form(s) with your materials.

Include a resume or biographical sketch. POSTMARK DEADLINE: OCTOBER 1, 2008.

Reports from our membership

Requiescant in pace

La Crosse native Robert Moevs, a composer of a rich body of orchestral, chamber, vocal and instrumental music passed away December 10, 2007. He was 87. Moevs was a 1938 graduate of Central High School who studied and taught at Harvard University. His sister, Marilyn Helminiak, said he had suffered from Parkinson's disease. He was buried two weeks ago in Oak Grove Cemetery in La Crosse. In 2003, Moevs was inducted into Central's Hall of Excellence.

Moevs graduated from Harvard in 1942. He served as a pilot and intelligence officer in the U.S. Air Force. He then studied for five years at the Fontainebleau School and at the Paris National Conservatory under Parisian music theory instructor Nadia Boulanger, who also taught Aaron Copland.

Moevs received his master's degree from Harvard in 1952, and was one of 12 Americans to receive the Prix de Rome. He was composer-in-residence at the American Academy in Rome and a Guggenheim Fellow. In 1978, he received the Stockhausen International Prize in Composition for his concerto grosso for piano and orchestra. The Boston Symphony, George Szell and the Cleveland Orchestra, and Leonard Bernstein also presented his works.

Congratulations to composer Dan Maske who has been selected as the winner of the 2007 UW-La Crosse/Wisconsin Alliance for Composers Symphony Orchestra Commission. Maske was chosen from the pool of Wisconsin composer entrants submitting works for consideration in the first annual commissioning project between the Wisconsin Alliance for Composers and UW-La Crosse's Symphony Orchestra. He received \$1000 to write a work for full orchestra that will be premiered by the UW-La Crosse symphony orchestra, directed by Dr. Enaldo Oliveira in the spring of 2008. Maske was also be invited to work with the orchestra members and director in residence before the premiere of the work.

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Composer Christopher Frye was commissioned to write a work for Jazz band and choir for the inauguration of chancellor Joseph Gow at UW-La Crosse. The work, "Let the Truth be Told" was performed October 19, 2007 for the inauguration ceremony in La Crosse.

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Joseph Koykkar's composition Panache, was released on the new Relache Ensemble CD-"Eight Point Turn"-in March 2008 on the Meyer Media label. In addition, his new orchestral work, "Beyond Circumstance" was premiered by the Wisconsin Youth Symphony on March 9, 2008. WYSO also commissioned the composition. Finally, His work for 2 pianos, "Keyboard Dances" will be featured on the January 25, 2009 concert of the MacDowell Club in Milwaukee. This concert is part of a series celebrating the 100th anniversary of the music organization. The concert will be at Cardinal Stritch College.

Reports from our membership

La Crosse New Music Festival 2007

The 8th annual La Crosse New Music Festival was held November 13, 14 and 15, 2007. The event featured a wide variety of instrumental, vocal, choral and electronic pieces. Christopher Burns was the guest composer while David Bohn, organist, was the guest performer. Burns presented a fascinating Lecture/Presentation on Laptop Improvisation Tuesday, November 13. The November 14th concert, held at Christ Episcopal Church, featured works for organ and choir. The festival showcased performances by the UW-La Crosse Concert Choir, Percussion Ensemble and Korean Percussion Ensemble and the Saint Mary's University Chamber Singers. Compositions by student composers including Emily Cooley, winner of the WAC Student Composition Contest were programmed throughout the festival. WAC composers who were represented include Christopher Burns, Gary Kent Walth, Christopher Frye, Wallace Cheatham, James Chaudoir, Michael Cunningham and Jerod Sommerfeldt. The La Crosse New Music Festival 2008 will be held November 4-5, 2008.

The MacDowell Club of Milwaukee is celebrating its centennial this season, and its concert series features works by a number of Wsiconsin composers: James Crowley's *Impromptu* will be heard on their concert on October 5th; works by S. Marion Verhaalen and Peter Baime on Nvember 9th; Daron Hagen and John Downey on December 14th; Jeffrey Honoré, Roger Ruggieri, Joe Koykkar, and Hildegarde Fischer on January 25th; S. Marion Verhaalen, Sigmund Snopek, Hildegarde Fischer, Wallace Cheatham, S. Theophane Hytrek, and David Bohn on February 1st; and S. Theophane Hytrek, John Downey, and Michael Torke on March 8th. All these concerts are at 2:30 and will occur in the Nancy Kendall Theater of Cardinal Stritch University, with the exception of the February 1st concert, which takes place at St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in Wauwatosa.

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Joel Blahnik's work *Our Home* was premiered at the Gibralter High School in Door County on May 20th, 2008. Scored for chorus and band and featuring a text by Gary Jones and the composer, the work was written in honor of the Gibralter Township Sesquicentennial, and was performed by the High School's band and chorus, conducted by Charles Eckhardt.

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David Bohn performed four programs around the state featuring works by Judith Baity, James Chaudoir, Wallace Cheatham, Robert Crane, Michael Cunningham, John Downey, Christopher Frye, and Charma Lepke. The programs were at St. John's Cathedral, Milwaukee (June 13, 2007, as part of the Cathedral's summer concert series), Holy Cross Catholic Church, Kaukauna (July 31, 2007, as part of the 2007 Lunchtime Concert Series in Appleton and environs), Christ Episcopal Church, La Crosse (November 14, 2007, as part of the La Crosse New Music Festival), and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside (March 14, 2008).

(WAC) is a non-profit tax-exempt corporation formed to promote the composition and performance of music by composers with present or past affiliations with the State or Wisconsin. Full membership (\$25 annually, \$10 for students) is open to any composer currently or previously residing in the State of Wisconsin. Associate membership (\$15 annually) is open to performers and other interested individuals supportive of new music in Wisconsin, regardless or place of residence. Institutional membership (\$25 annually) is open to orchestras, schools, music departments, libraries, foundations, and similar institutions, regardless of location.
